- What is product substitution?
- A product that can be used in place of a similar product
 - Eg:-If an item is out of stock



• A cheaper product has been used instead of a more expensive one in order to reduce costs

- Claims to be the original product (counterfeit)
- Compromises performance
- Creates legacy issues affecting warranties and guarantees





7.16 Part 4 of this chapter recommends market surveillance of construction products at a national level. The proposed market surveillance body would drive the introduction of risk-based testing, to ensure that inappropriate **product substitution** or evolution, as well as any element of gaming the system, is tackled.....

7.1 Assessments in lieu of tests (also known as 'desktop studies') should only be used in a very limited number of cases. Where they are used, they must be carried out by people who are qualified or competent, and must be properly documented.

7.2.....it is apparent that the current system makes it difficult to know whether the right products are being used.

7.4significant further work is needed in order to create a comprehensive regime that ensures that all products used in construction are properly tested, certified, labelled and marketed.

7.5 Part 1 of this chapter sets out recommendations to establish a more transparent testing regime, with appropriate retesting, to ensure greater robustness in the testing system.

& it's affects on product certification Why is it such an issue?

- Industry response by Construction Products Association (CPA) Marketing Integrity Group (MIG)
- Ensure construction product information is provided in a clear and unambiguous way
- Call for evidence attracted 524 responses
- Executive summary- Most respondents are aware of substitution occurring within the last 12 months. In more than half of the projects involving substitution, the substitution was not discussed and agreed among the project team, and the performance criteria of the replacement product were not compared to the original to ensure that they were equivalent.
- Users have mixed experiences of product substitution: in some cases negative, in others positive.



- Evaluate the continuing validity of 3rd party certification
